NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

This application is very similar to the seasonal application we processed last year, August 2020. However, last year's application was for deficit irrigation. This year, the proposal calls for fallowing three (3) irrigated acres at the existing place of use and irrigating three (3) acres at the proposed additional place of use. Therefore, this year's proposal is a much-preferred one for one transfer.

This is a seasonal change application to change a portion of S4-83449-J in order to add a new point of diversion and add a new place of use. The existing point of diversion is upstream, 450 feet north and 350 feet east from the south quarter corner of Section 21, within the SW 1/4 SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 21, T. 16 N., R. 15 E.W.M., of the proposed additional point of diversion. The applicant's property does not currently have water rights. This seasonal change will allow the applicant to continue to irrigate a portion, 3 acres, of his 5 acre parcel. The applicant has 5 horses that he feeds hay and grains year round. This water will be utilized in the horse corral area for dust control and the propagation of pasture. This seasonal change will result in the fallowing of 3 acres from Yakima County Parcel No. 151628-43401. There is no regulator history for S4-83398-J not being fulfilled. Ecology believes that this transfer will not impair any existing rights.




Figure 1. Map with proposed additional place of use, proposed additional point of diversion, and location of the portion of S4-83449-J to be changed.
