Description of Proposed Works

Description of water diversion/withdrawal, conveyance, and distribution system: Transferred quantities will be sourced via an existing water system which currently conveys domestic and irrigation water to the proposed place of use. This system utilizes 50hp and 30hp pumps to source water for delivery via an 8in mainline. These pumps run separately depending on the lake water level. A 20hp booster pump is used to push water to the highest elevations.

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History of water use

Describe the historical water use information that was considered by the board:

Water rights SWC 878 and SWC 467 were historically used to supply water for domestic use and a total of 40ac orchard. Portions of these rights occurring along the eastern edge of the place of use extend beyond the Chelan-Manson highway. Historic aerial images indicate the prior presence of some orchard within this area. To accommodate the expanding right-of-way for the highway, approximately 9ac of orchard was removed from this area sometime after 1998 and relocated to the N1/2 SWSE Sec. 11 pursuant to de fact change. Properties east of the highway have since been sold to the Washington State Department of Transportation and various other parties. Temporary trust applications were filed in 2015 and information regarding these water rights was communicated directly to all affected property owners. No protests or objections were received at that time and the trust donations were accepted by Ecology in 2016. The City of Chelan has also confirmed that it provides municipal water service to these properties which no longer receive water from the separate irrigation system. Copies of these materials were provided with the subject application.

Larry Lehmbecker purchased S1/2 NWSE Sec. 11 in 2002 and the N1/2 NWSE Sec. 11 in 2006. Water rights SWC 467 and 878 each authorize 20ac irrigation within respective portions of the north and south halves of NWSE Sec. 11. The formerly separate water systems serving these properties have been intertied since 2006. Power use for

each point of diversion continues to be recorded by separate electrical meters. However, due to the reconfiguration of the system, it is not possible to separately determine the quantities conveyed to each place of use.

Mr. Lehmbecker acquired these properties with the intent of redeveloping them as vineyard with residential development. In 2013, Larry sold portions of the property intended for residential use to a local developer D.B.A. Chelan Lookout LLC and retained title to the subject water rights via deed. Lookout subsequently completed construction of residential portions of the Project. Mr. Lehmbecker filed a short plat and boundary line adjustment for the Vindaluc Winery with the City of Chelan in 2014. These items were approved in 2015. During that same year, Larry filed temporary trust donations to preserve quantities no longer required for orchard irrigation (see previous changes below). Ecology accepted portions of the subject rights into trust pursuant to trust decisions CS4-SWC00878 and CS4-SWC00467. Following trust donation, Larry has continued to irrigate a combination of approximately 13.2ac of orchard, vineyard, pasture, and landscape.

Previous changes

Describe any previous change decisions associated with the water right:

In 2015, Mr. Lehmbecker applied to place portions of water rights SWC 878 and 467 into trust. Ecology accepted portions of these rights into temporary trust in 2016 pursuant to trust decisions CS4-SWC00878 and CS4-SWC00467. At that time, Tom Perkow of Ecology mapped the area of irrigation occurring within the authorized places of use and determined that the maximum area of irrigation attributable to SWC 878 was 14ac and 10.6ac for SWC 467 between 2011 and 2015. As such, the total quantities accepted into trust for both rights consisted of 97.47af with 42.28af reserved for continued irrigation. The irrigation duty associated with these donations was 5.6af/ac assuming an application efficiency of 67% as indicated in the trust applications. Ecology trust decision letter dated 12/28/2016 further advised that 9ac of irrigation appeared to be occurring outside of the place of both rights. Ecology excluded water use occurring within this de facto area from the trust donation analysis. As articulated in Ecology's letter, the total area of irrigation occurring under both rights between 2011-2015 was 33.6ac (14ac + 10.6ac + 9ac).

In 2020, Larry applied to renew/extend the subject trust donations as per CS4-SWC00467@2 and CS4-SWC00878@2. In anticipation of the subject water sale and transfer, Mr. Lehmbecker filed a request in December of 2020 to remove the rights from trust. This request remains pending at Ecology.

The subject application seeks to bring existing uses into compliance. Transferred quantities will be sourced and conveyed via an existing water system which currently serves the proposed place of use. This location utilizes a 50hp and 30hp pump to supply an 8in mainline. These pumps run separately depending on the lake water level. A 20hp booster pump is used to push water to the highest elevations on the property. Water is applied at this location via over and under-tree impact applicators. The development schedule includes 2yrs to allow for installation of a water meter at the proposed place of use. Two years are needed b/c it is not possible to predict when Ecology will issue a final decision on this application and b/c irrigation equipment is difficult to source as a result of supply chain issues related to the pandemic.

Other water rights appurtenant to the property (if applicable)

Describe any other water rights or other water uses associated with both the current and proposed place of use and an explanation of how those other rights or uses will be exercised in conjunction with the right proposed to be transferred. In addition to SWC00878, Mr. Lehmbecker holds title to water right SWC00467 which has been used to irrigate 20ac adjacent to the northern boarder of the subject right. Portions of both rights were previously placed into trust with Ecology.

The City of Chelan provides domestic water service within the place of use of SWC00878 and SWC00467. The City maintains and administers a separate portfolio of water rights.

The proposed place of use is irrigated pursuant to S4-01443C which authorizes 1.36cfs for the irrigation of 86ac. If approved, transferred portions of the subject right will be additive to water right S4-01443. WD Peterson Orchard has filed two separate requests for administrative division of this right which are pending at Ecology. After processing these requests, WD Peterson's remaining portion of S4-01443C will be 0.5982cfs for the irrigation of 38.4ac.

Tentative Determination

In order to make a water right change decision, the Board must make a tentative determination on the validity and extent of the right. The Board has made the tentative determination as displayed upon the first page of this report. There are several circumstances that can cause the board's tentative determination to differ from the stated extent of the water right within water right documentation. Water right documents attempt to define a maximum limitation to a water right, rather than the actual extent to which a water right has been developed and maintained through historic beneficial use. Additionally, except for a sufficient cause pursuant to RCW 90.14.140, water rights, in whole or in part, not put to a beneficial use for five consecutive years since 1967 may be subject to relinquishment under Chapter 90.14.130 through 90.14.180 RCW. Water rights may additionally be lost through abandonment. The Board's tentative determination was based upon the following findings. Describe any information indicating that an existing water right or portion of a water right has been relinquished or abandoned due to nonuse and the basis for the determination.

Water rights SWC 878 and 467 were historically sourced via adjacent diversion pumps and conveyed via separate water systems. Power consumption has been and is metered separately for each pump. Power records for each source were provided with the application. However, since 2006 the water systems have been intertied. As such, it is not possible to separately evaluate power consumption and related water use for each place of use. Concurrent change applications have been filed for both rights. Therefore, the Board's tentative determination evaluates the extent and validity of all water use occurring under both water rights SWC878 and 467.

In 2016, portions of the subject rights were accepted into trust by Ecology. As discussed in the Previous Changes Section above, Ecology staff mapped a maximum irrigated area of 10.6ac for SWC 467 and 14.0ac for SWC 878 during 2011-2015. Ecology's trust decision letter advised that 9 additional acres of irrigation appeared outside of the authorized place of use for both rights. This location was developed pursuant to de facto change when portions of the orchard were relocated to accommodate expansion of the highway. Ecology excluded water use occurring within the de facto area from the trust calculation. Per Ecology's direction, the subject application seeks to add the de facto area to the authorized place of use. Of this area, 1.12ac occur within City of Chelan parcel #272211430650. Mr. Lehmbecker asserts no claim or right to any water use occurring outside of his property. Therefore, the total irrigated area attributable to both rights is 32.48ac (10.6 + 14 + 9 - 1.12). Aerial images from prior to 2011consistently indicate an irrigated area of no less than 32.48ac. The Board therefore concludes that this is the maximum acreage that remains valid for change under both rights.

Ecology's trust decisions assumed an irrigation duty of 5.6ft/ac based upon the content of the trust applications. During the period of review (2011-2015), the AgriMet Station for Manson indicates an apple orchard crop irrigation requirement of 30.2in/ac (2011), 31.8in/ac (2012), 31.5in/ac (2013), 30.9in/ac (2014), and 31.6in/ac

(2015). 31.8in/ac is the highest use during this period. Applying an efficiency rate of 67% as indicated in the 2015 trust applications results in a total irrigation requirement of 3.95ft/ac. As such, the total annual quantity for 32.48ac is 128.3af which is less than the quantities previously calculated for trust due to the application of AgriMet data. Power use calculations prepared by a Professional Engineer and provided by Mr. Lehmbecker indicate the use of water in excess of those quantities calculated using AgriMet data. Mr. Lehmbecker has provided a declaration which declares that all quantities calculated using power used data were applied for irrigation. However, due to concerns regarding the water system's reconfiguration and the reliability of power data, the Board relied on AgriMet data for its tentative determination.

The application rate assigned by the certificate and as used on the farm is 0.0135cfs/ac. As such, the Board tentatively determines the extent and validity of the rights is 0.19cfs and 55.3af for 14ac for SWC 878 and 0.25cfs and 73af for 18.48ac for SWC 467.

Former domestic quantities have been abandoned and/or relinquished and are now purveyed by the City.

The subject right is authorized for domestic use and irrigation. Domestic water is supplied to the place of use by the City of Chelan. 0.5af of the subject irrigation right will be changed to continuous singled domestic use which will require a season of use change for that portion of the right. Lake Chelan is artificially controlled by the PUD such that sufficient quantities are available for domesitic use on a year-round basis. No new uses are proposed and no changes to consumptive use shall occur.

The extent and validity of the right is 0.19cfs and 55.3af for the seasonal irrigation of 14ac.

Domestic use has been abandoned and/or relinquished due to the provision of water service from the City which maintains a separate water right portfolio.

The Board authorizes the change and transfer of 0.135cfs and 40.5af for 10ac irrigation and continuous single domestic use within the proposed place of use and as further articulated within the Board's Decision Box which appears on page 3 of this report. Portion (A) of the right shall be retained by Mr. Lehmbecker and Portion (B) of the right shall transfer to WD Peterson. The existing place of use is changed to add de facto areas of beneficial use located within the N1/2 SWSE Sec. 11. The purpose of this transfer is to bringing existing water uses at the proposed place of use into compliance. As such, no development schedule is required. Transferred quantities shall be additive to portions of S4-SWC01443 which are owned by WD Peterson Orchards. Mr. Lehmbecker shall retain title to portions of the right not authorized for transfer.

- 2. This authorization shall in no way excuse the permittee from compliance with any applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, or regulations including those administered by other programs of the Department of Ecology.
- 3.Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the project location, and to inspect at reasonable times, records of water use, well diversions, measuring devices and associated distribution systems for compliance with water law.
- 4.An approved measuring device must be installed and maintained for portion (B) of the authorization in accordance with the rule "Requirements for Measuring and Reporting Water Use," WAC 173-173, which describes the requirements for data accuracy, device installation and operation, and information reporting.
- 5. Water use data shall be recorded monthly. Recorded water use data shall be submitted annually to Ecology via the internet. To set up an internet reporting account, contact the Central Regional Office. If you do not have internet access, you can still submit hard copies by contacting the Central Regional Office for forms to submit you water use data.
- 6. The water right holder is required to maintain efficient water delivery systems and use of up-to-date water conservation practices consistent with RCW 90.03.005.
- 7. Upon transfer and application to beneficial use, portion (B) of this change decision shall longer be subject to DFD protections. DFD protections shall continue to apply to portion (A).
