






























What does the Interpretive Statement mean?

Water Right Permitting for John Day/McNary Pools

Office of Columbia River (OCR)



Begin Permit Process File Water Right Application

- Is the diversion located in the John Day/McNary reserve area?
- ¤ Yes. Go to Hurdles A & B
- ^{II} No. Go to Hurdle B
- RCW 90.03.290 Four Part Test
- Beneficial Use

 Public Interest
- ¤ Impairment

- BiOp (FCRPS)
- Federal Reserve Rights (Tribal)
- Flood Control (Columbia River Treaty)

Hurdle A - Chapter 173-531A WAC

All new water rights debited to the reservation.

- Reservation limits water for specific use.
- Reserve water rights are interruptible.
- Reservation allows for either:
 irrigation use of 1.32 million
 ac-ft for 330,000 acres of
 land
- ^{26,000} ac-ft of municipal supply

Hurdle B Chapter - 173-563 WAC

New water rights are subject to the Columbia River Instream Flow Protections.

- May be curtailed when March 1st runoff forecast at The Dalles is less than 88 million ac-ft.
- Applies to first 4.5 thousand cubic ft/second.

Solution - Chapter 90.90 RCW

- Columbia River basin development account.
 Allows for issuance of water rights with greater reliability during dry years.
- OCR developed mitigated supplies for specific uses.
- Provides mitigated water senior to instream flow rule.
- More directed solutions and provisioning in order to protect resources.

Solution - WAC 173-563-020(4)

Consultation in lieu of automatic instream flow provisioning.

- OCR conducts consultation with all stakeholders in order to evaluate impacts to fish and water rights.
- Conducted for each application, on a case-bycase basis.
- Allows for more directed solutions and provisioning in order to protect resources.


