

Online Study Guide for Certified Water Rights Examiners

November 2019

Ecology offers the following information to applicants preparing to become a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE). In order to pass the test the applicant will need a *working* knowledge of Washington State water law and regulations. As required in RCW 90.03.665, the following subjects will be covered on the test:

- a) Water law in Washington State.
- b) Measurement of the flow of water through open channels and enclosed pipes.
- c) Water use and water level reporting.
- d) Estimation of the capacity of reservoirs and ponds.
- e) Irrigation crop water requirements.
- f) Aerial photo interpretation.
- g) Legal descriptions of land parcels.
- h) Location of land and water infrastructure through the use of maps and global positioning.
- i) Proper construction and sealing of well bores.
- j) Other topics related to the preparation and certification of water rights in Washington State.
